

FALL HIGHLIGHTS

OHIO VALLEY

On October 25, 2021, an ORSANCO Ohio River Sweep event took place including WIMOs members in collaboration with Marathon Petroleum Company. 19 volunteers including Ohio Valley WIMOs chapter members Tiphani Massie, Carla Mings, and Rainey Mosley from Marathon, and Randi Webb with Superior Marine Ways, Inc., collected waste from more than a half-mile of the riverbanks in downtown Catlettsburg, KY and in Kenova, WV.

In previous years, the Ohio River Sweep was an annual volunteer cleanup extending the entire length of the Ohio River through six states organized by the Ohio River Valley Water Sanitation Commission (ORSANCO). COVID led to an adjustment relying on smaller Ohio River Sweep events to be organized at local levels in partnership with ORSANCO.

With the WIMOs Ohio Valley chapter newly formed, members were excited about an opportunity to hold a collaborative event and to help clean up the rivers along which they live and work. WIMOs members unable to travel to the Catlettsburg-based event due to the ongoing pandemic were encouraged to clean up waterways more local to them.

It was a great event and volunteers are already looking forward to participating in 2022.

IN MEMORY: MARY ANN MCMILLION

LOGISTICS MANAGER AT COOPER CONSOLIDATED FRIEND, LOVED ONE, AND SUPPORTER OF WOMEN IN MARITIME PASSED AWAY SEPTEMBER 25, 2021

Those who knew Mary Ann McMillion describe her as someone who was as passionate about people as she was about her job. When coworkers from other regions of the country came to visit, they didn't want to go home because Mary Ann made a work environment that was "just fun". She was always on call for anyone, 24/7. "She had some big shoulders" says Laura Bergeron, who worked with her for nine years, "she didn't mind taking on anything."

Mary Ann was known for supporting an atmosphere of teamwork, having fun but taking the job seriously. She set high expectations for those who worked for her, but she held herself to those same standards. She treated the dispatchers like she was their mom, and one of her nicknames was "Momma Mary". She was "fierce", and would go "toe to toe with anybody". Laura and Heather Stafford tell a story of a time she came in and heard a boat captain bashing her dispatchers on the radio. Mary Ann picked up that radio and set him right.

Mary Ann is also known for setting up girls getaway weekends down to the last detail. She made sure everything was taken care of so her friends could just show up and have a good time. She was a very detail-oriented person.

Mary Ann leaves behind her lifetime partner, Hoyt, and a brother and sister as well as nieces and nephews. She also leaves behind her dog Princess Lucy and an entire community of maritime workers on the Inland Waterways. She will be missed.


